In honor of Hispanic Heritage Month, emerging artist, Wilson Mape will be exhibiting his work with the Noyes Museum of Art at the Kramer Hall location in Hammonton, NJ. Mape was born in Neiva, Colombia and is a psychologist with 15 years of experience in clinical and educational context. He has developed skills in drawing, painting, and mosaic. With these skills he has made therapeutic and pedagogical interventions with children, teenagers and adults.

This exhibition is an exercise in gratitude and evocation and is made up of the faces of people he has met in his life. Each stroke brings back fond memories of the person that he is drawing, allowing him to relive those moments

of shared experiences and emotions. Mape's intention is to "capture and sketch the essence of his/her gaze, the connotation of his/her smile, the details of his/her lines, the uniqueness of his/her humanity on his/her face.
